

Hidden Pictures in The Old Testament - An Introduction to Typology

Typology is one of the most fascinating, yet most neglected arenas of Bible Study and understanding. There are multiple unmistakable pictures of Jesus all through the Old Testament. Definitive foreshadows of Christ and His work that flood our minds, hearts and souls with beauty. These portraits build our faith in Christ and our confidence in the unity and coherence of Scripture.

The oft-quoted saying is so true, *“The new is in the old concealed - the old is in the new revealed.”*

We know that there are numerous NT references that remind us of the value of the OT. *“Philip began at the same Scripture and preached Jesus”* Acts 8:35 (He was reading from the prophet Isaiah). We understand that we get our concepts and vocabulary from the OT and that the OT is fulfilled in the NT.

Luke 24:25-27 *And He said to them, “O foolish men and slow of heart to believe in all that the prophets have spoken! “Was it not necessary for the Christ to suffer these things and to enter into His glory?” Then beginning with Moses and with all the prophets, He explained to them the things concerning Himself in all the Scriptures.*

Luke 24:44-45 *Now He said to them, “These are My words which I spoke to you while I was still with you, that all things which are written about Me in the Law of Moses and the Prophets and the Psalms must be fulfilled.” Then He opened their minds to understand the Scriptures,*

I Corinthians 10:11 *Now these things happened to them as an example, and they were written for our instruction, upon whom the ends of the ages have come.*

Romans 15:4 *For whatever was written in earlier times was written for our instruction, so that through perseverance and the encouragement of the Scriptures we might have hope.*
